Help Available

Computers

Computer terminals with internet access are located in the Reference Room. They are available in half-hour increments on a first-come, first-served basis. Laptops and ipads are also available. There is high-speed wireless internet access throughout the Library.

The Library Associates is a group of volunteers dedicated to supporting, through its fundraising efforts, free programs and activities that expand and enhance regular library operations.



Proceeds support concerts, literary programs, film screenings, the Norfolk Library Book Group, museum passes, children's programs, and the library newsletter. Membership in the Library Associates is open to any person who wishes to contribute his or her time and talents to the Library.

Art Exhibits

The Library presents new artwork each month. The Associates host a reception for featured artists on the first Sunday of the month from 4:00 pm–6:00 pm. Prospective exhibitors are asked to submit portfolios to the Library Art Committee approximately one year in advance.

Literary Programs

Slide lectures, author talks, and book signings are among the many programs offered throughout the year.

Concert Series

From September to May, the Associates sponsor performances by top-rated musicians. A wide range of music is showcased.

Films

Enjoy watching documentaries and film classics on the Library's big screen.

Circulation Policies & Procedures

Borrower Responsibilities

- Borrowers are responsible for the timely return of materials charged to their cards and for any fines or fees associated with those items.
- Parents /guardians are responsible for guiding the selection and return of library materials by their children and for the items they check out.
- Postal and email addresses should be updated at the Circulation Desk.

Overdue Policies

Late notices are emailed for items more than 10 days overdue. DVDs accrue a late fee of \$1.00 per day. If an item is lost, the borrower will be charged the replacement cost. An excessive amount of overdue and/ or lost books will result in the suspension of library privileges until the charges have been paid.

Renewals

All items may be renewed unless on hold for another borrower. Renewals may be made by phone.

The Norfolk Library

An educational and cultural center serving patrons from Norfolk, Connecticut, and neighboring communities

E stablished in 1888, the Norfolk Library began as a gift from Isabella Eldridge to the town she so loved. The original building and the 1911 addition were designed by Hartford architect George Keller. In 1985, the Smith Children's Room, designed by Alec Frost, was added, made possible by gifts from Abel I. Smith and others.

Through generous donations by many members of the community and a grant from the CT State Office of Historic Preservation, a restoration of the exterior was undertaken in 2015, returning the terra-cotta tile roof to the building.

The Library is a private institution that serves the public and is administered by a Board of Trustees chosen from the community.


